EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2019-2021

A. Agency functions and organization:

Brief History:

The North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) was established in 1967 by the North Dakota State Legislature. It is the state agency responsible for the support and development of the arts and artists throughout the State. The Council's Board is composed of nine members, one at large and one from each of the eight service regions of the state. The board establishes policies and programs, allocates grant funds based on recommendations from peer panels and provides oversight to the staff. Board members are appointed by the Governor and serve a five-year term; the Council Chairs during this biennium were David Trottier from Rugby and Searle Swedlund from Valley City. 2019 saw two new appointments: Kent Kapplinger, Fargo – Region 5, and Kimberly Gaugler, Beach – Region 8. At-large Chair Trottier resigned after 30 years of service, and in 2020 Tami Jollie-Trottier from Belcourt - Region 3 joined the board along with Jeff Hoff from Jamestown – Region 6. In 2021, Erin Belgarde of Belcourt joined the board from Region 3. The listings for the current board and staff members are on pages 12 and 13.

In order to meet the goals of the North Dakota Council on the Arts as mandated by the North Dakota legislative statute, the Council divided its functions into four primary grant program areas: Institutional Support, Arts in Education, Community Services, and Traditional/Folk Arts. Among others, NDCA has strategic partnerships with Humanities ND, Prairie Public Broadcasting, ND Parks & Recreation, ND-DOT and Arts Midwest.

Major funding for NDCA comes from the North Dakota State Legislature and the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). Through these funds the Council was able to provide a variety of grants to communities, art organizations, schools, teachers, and artists across the state. Peer panels were utilized for the review of all grant applications. The North Dakota Cultural Endowment Fund was the source for funding of the Individual Artist Fellowships during this biennium.

Major Programs and Activities:

The following gives a brief description of grants available through the Council during the 2019-2021 biennium:

Institutional Support (three-year support) benefits artists, arts organizations, and the public. The program provides staffed non-profit arts organizations with general operating support and project support for performances, exhibitions, publications, classes, workshops, and special events in all arts disciplines. Grants are \$3,000-\$11,000 (Requires a 1:1 cash match.)

Community Arts Access Tier 1 & 2 (Annual application) For up to \$3,000, *Tier 1* is offered to organizations in communities under 6,000 that do not qualify for other major NDCA grants for the purpose of presenting arts programs. It also supports organizations in communities of all sizes that make targeted efforts to serve special constituencies or minority groups. *Tier 2* is offered to organizations in communities with populations over 6,000. (Requires a 1:1 match.)

Special Projects (rolling application) provides an opportunity for organizations and individuals to initiate new community arts projects and to take advantage of possible touring events up to \$1,250. (Requires a 1:1 match, with up to 50% in-kind.)

Artist-in-Residence (rolling application) is a noncompetitive reimbursement program that provides support for North Dakota preK-12 students and teachers to work with professional artists either in a traditional school setting or during after-school and/or summer programs. Residencies include 20 or more contact hours spanning four days or longer.

Arts in Education Collaboration (annual application) is a program that provides funding to arts organizations, schools, school districts, nonprofits, and government agencies to build collaborations and community partnerships that strive to increase access to high-quality, sustained arts education for K-12 North Dakota students.

Professional Development (rolling application) provides financial assistance up to \$1,000/80% for informational/educational opportunities relating to the arts and arts development for artists, educators, and organization board members and administrators.

Folk and Traditional Arts Apprenticeships (annual application) honors and encourages the preservation of North Dakota's diverse living traditions that allow master traditional artists to pass their skills and knowledge to apprentices on a one-to-one basis.

Individual Artist Fellowships (annual application for two-\$3,500 fellowships reflecting rotating disciplines) assists ND artists in new project development and/or their personal professional development.

Letters of Agreement: are written for programs that fall outside the traditional grant offerings, such as *Art for Life* (which brings the arts to elder care facilities) as well as partnerships between the Council and other entities for work on common goals.

B. COVID Response

NDCA staff went left the office on March 13, 2019 and continued to work from home through Spring FY21. Office space in the Century Building was relinquished in January 2021, and NDCA moved to a new space in a privately owned building in downtown Bismarck in February 2021.

Staff immediately pivoted with their programs to online and outdoor offerings to keep communities, families and workers engaged. The arts offered solace as well as entertainment and learning opportunities. NDCA worked with the Governor's COVID team to help spread the word and continue engagement, *which witnessed increased participation*.

NDCA reacted quickly and nimbly in response to COVID-19.

- Supported teachers, students and the public as they pivoted to online arts activities
- Supported safe programs at senior care facilities throughout the state and brought music to online church services and many outdoor venues
- Convened diverse arts groups to listen, share and learn about potential solutions and resources
- Collected data to gauge economic impact
- Provided a myriad of resources available online for all citizens of the state
- Administered and facilitated grant funds for 323 individuals and organizations through National, Regional and State CARES ACT Funds from four separate funders. *We cannot emphasize enough that NDCA developed, launched, and implemented new grant programs to quickly disseminate new, covid-relief funding – almost the equivalent of an entire biennium.* {NEA \$371,700, Arts Midwest \$70,368, The Bush Foundation \$55,000, and ND/OMB \$751,790} for a total of \$1,248,858 above prior appropriations. At the same time, we had to contract with outside consultants in order to turn around the \$800,000 in year-end CARES Act funding from ND.}

The arts were a huge part of holding communities together throughout the pandemic. COVID-19 had a dramatic effect on the arts and culture community. In the first few months of the crisis, North Dakota arts and culture lost millions of dollars. In addition, national studies show that as many as 91% of North Dakota's arts and culture sector jobs and 35% of its organizations may still be at risk of closure. NDCA has been the calm in the storm for this sector, connecting and listening to constituents, assisting with ND Smart ReStart, and providing over \$1.2 million of pass-through funds to individuals and organizations in the arts and culture sector specifically in response to COVID-19 losses – funds the state could not have managed without NDCA.

C. Summary of accomplishments and activities during the biennium:

Key Points:

NDCA began its reinvention from being recognized solely as a funding agency to a community partner and economic driver of the arts.

- Shifted internal workflows and systems to better accommodate rhythms of grantees.
- Launched a new, more user-friendly grants management system that will facilitate data-gathering and sharing.
- Converted to telework in response to COVID-19 while planning for office accessibility and visibility.
- Creatively stretching staff capacity while providing hands-on education and experiences for UMary and Carnegie Mellon students, including telework and COVID-19 responses.
- NDCA made significant progress toward cultural equity, accessibility, inclusion, and reaching communities traditionally underserved by the arts using policy statements, a conference on accessibility, resources for Veteran's arts, and national visibility through the Smithsonian Institution and Kennedy Center.

Grants and Fellowships:

The Arts in Education program funded activities in each of the eight regions of the state during the biennium and included 22 Artist-in-Residencies (AIR) and 24 Arts in Education Collaboration (AIEC) grants offering students hands-on experience with one or more art forms and support to teachers for teaching in and through the arts. During this biennium approximately 9,950 students and 760 teachers participated in AIR and AIEC programs.

During the biennium, the Council awarded 110 grants to organizations through Institutional Support; 48 Community Arts Access grants were administered to rural communities; 20 Professional Development grants were given to artists, arts administrators, and teachers. Special Projects grants helped fund 14 arts in community projects. In 2019 two Individual Fellowships of \$3,500 were given in the category of music to composers Emerson Eads (Minot) and Tom Porter (Bismarck). In 2020, three Fellowships were given to Choreographers Shalini Agarwal and Hamzat Koriko from Fargo and Grand Forks respectively, and Costumer Camilla Morrison from Grand Forks. The total granted was \$7,000.

To preserve our state's cultural heritage, Folk and Traditional Arts Apprenticeship grants were awarded over the biennium to 46 apprenticeship teams with 107 artists, resulting in 442 artworks created, and 42 public performances before 714 children and 2,454 adults. In addition, many artworks and traditions were identified and documented through fieldwork by the NDCA folklorist throughout the biennium. These grants have reached very small towns as well as our larger towns and people as young as 9 and as old as 84. For example, master blacksmith Dennis Schill of Hannah (pop. 12) and his

apprentices Tim Sr., Tim Jr., and Teagen Seavey of Osnabrock (pop. 163) and master Finnish weaver Annikki Marttila (84) who taught Sky Purdin of Fargo. Artists and fieldwork from ND's American Indian Reservations such as Turtle Mountain were represented as well as New American and/or recent refugee communities like Bhutanese, Bosnian, West African, and East Indian. Our program also encourages father/children or mother/children family apprentices learning together from a master.

54 additional grants were awarded during the biennium, but funds were returned to NDCA, as planned activities couldn't take place due to COVID.

Programs:

The Art for Life Program partners with 15 communities with some being ongoing and others involving partners that do outreach to different communities from year to year. Those two partners are the Chahinkapa Zoo Association (with activities inspired by animal visits with elders and kids from schools) and Dakota Legacy to develop audio pieces about folklife in North Dakota by engaging elder interviews for the series *TellTale*. Additionally, we began a special ongoing effort focused on veterans. In each community, we bring together a local arts/cultural organization, elder care facility, and school. In some partner sites, children from local schools interact through arts with elders once a week. The Art for Life Program goal is to improve the emotional and physical health of elders through intensive, ongoing art, especially folk art, and artist interaction as well as fosters community engagement. This program is nationally recognized.

Poetry Out Loud: Poetry Out Loud, a partnership with the NEA, the Poetry Foundation, and state arts agencies, started in 2006. This is a statewide program that encourages high school students to become familiar with great poetry through memorization, performance, and competition. The North Dakota State Champion for 2020 was Maria Kalb, a student from Saint Mary's Central High School in Bismarck, ND. Due to COVID restrictions, State POL Champions were unable to participate in the National POL Competition in Washington, DC. Rather, students were honored virtually through a National POL presentation. The 2021 ND State POL Competition was held virtually with top honors going to Kylie Howatt, a student at Northern Cass High School. Approximately 77 teachers and 4,676 students participated in the POL program during the biennium. In conjunction with the Poetry Out Loud program, 12 poetry workshops were conducted in participating schools by various ND poets, along with two presentations for the FY20 and FY21 ND Council of English Teachers Conference, and 3 virtual poetry lessons to support online/remote learning.

In partnership with North Dakota Parks and Recreation, Arts Residencies continued in North Dakota State Parks. These residencies support North Dakota artists in creating works of art that showcase, document and celebrate the parks while providing opportunities for visitors to become stewards, with a deeper appreciation of artistic works inspired by the state parks. The three parks involved in 2021 were Cross Ranch State Park (Jonathan Campbell, Bismarck), Turtle River State Park (Megan Hanson, Grand Forks) and Lewis & Clark State Park (Shalini Agarwal, Fargo). 2020 saw artists in residence at Lake Metigoshe State Park (Jennifer Matthews, Mandan), Fort Ransom State Park (Linda Roesch, Jamestown), and Stevenson State Park (Karen Bakke, Fargo). These residencies work very well for the artists and the Arts Council as well as many park visitors, including adults and children.

Accessibility Convening Online took place in fall 2020 – the first NDCA offering in over a decade - with a grant from the Consensus Council and record attendance. The focus was on accessibility within

organizational operation, social media, facilities, programming, sharing best practices, and celebrated the 30th anniversary of the Americans with Disabilities Act. This was presented later that fall to a national audience of state accessibility coordinators through the National Endowment for the Arts.

Teacher/Artist Professional Development: As a part of the Arts in Education program, funding was provided to partnering organizations to facilitate teacher professional development focused on arts-based, teaching strategies, including: Picturing Writing, Image Making, Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS), and Beat the Odds. Two professional development workshops were also provided to North Dakota teaching artists who work with schools through the Artist in Residence and Arts in Education Collaboration Grant Programs.

Arts in Education Partnerships: Arts in Education Partnerships continued to expand during the biennium. Partners included: Central Region Education Association, South East Education Cooperative, ND Afterschool Network, Northeast Education Services Cooperative, ConnectEd, Bismarck Library Foundation, Bismarck Art and Gallery, Lutheran Social Services, North Dakota Department of Public Instruction, City of Kenmare, Humanities North Dakota, Souris Basin Foundation, and Jamestown Fine Arts Association. In response to COVID-19 restrictions, new partnerships were established to increase access to arts learning for ND students throughout the state. This included funding to support afterschool arts learning through the SEEC/ND Afterschool Network and online/virtual arts lessons through NESC/ConnectEd. Through these partnerships, NDCA provided support for arts-based projects impacting over 13,156 students, 614 teachers and 85 artists.

Other NDCA Programs:

Arts Across the Prairie: Placemaking in Rural North Dakota is NDCA's newest Statewide program a first-of-its-kind, statewide, public art program. Eight large-scale public installations – one for each geographic region in the state – will be created that reflect the unique history, landscape, and cultural heritage of these regions. All eight works will be placed in rural locations. This statewide program is in collaboration with the North Dakota Department of Transportation (a first) and North Dakota Tourism. In addition, the Legislature allocated \$1 Million to NDCA's Endowment Fund specifically for the purpose of funding maintenance in all eight regions from the interest earned.

Arts Across the Prairie was developed to celebrate the cultural heritage of rural areas, foster creative relationships across counties and regions, bolster NDCA's role as a rural development partner, and spur economic development through tourism. Furthermore, as a community-driven initiative, it aims to promote civic pride, affirm uniqueness of place, and strengthen cultural identity. This program will create public-private partnerships throughout the state and will provide a national model of this type of creative placekeeping. In this biennium, Region 1 formed a stakeholder group and work is underway.

Participation in Governor Burgum's Strategy Review: NDCA participated in the Governor's Strategic Review Process in early 2019 and 2021. This is always an important step in clarifying the organization's mission and budget in preparation for the Legislative Session and the organization's Strategic Plan.

Strategic Plan: Work began on NDCA's Strategic Plan in winter 2018 and extended through FY19 with site visits conducted throughout the state on a Listening Tour. The tour included 40+ meetings and spanned 25+ cities, 20+ counties, all eight regions, and two reservations. It also included well over 650 participants and attracted 16 legislators.

Early in 2019, NDCA hired Sara Peterson Consulting (Indiana) to guide us through this process of introspection and looking forward. A change was made from a three-year to a five-year plan, to better accommodate staff resources as well as a longer-vision process. There were 22 interviews held with the board, staff and key stakeholders. Internal documentation was reviewed, and data analyzed. Governor's Award for the Arts reception and ceremony was established in 1977 as a way of recognizing individuals and organizations that have made outstanding contributions to the arts throughout the state. Governor Burgum officiated at the 2019 Awards along with emcee David Trottier. From 26 nominations, the six selected were as follows: Arts in Education: Annette Hovey (New Rockford), Arts Organization: Jamestown Fine Arts Association (Jamestown), Cultural Treasure: John Gross (Napoleon), Individual Achievement: David Borlaug (Bismarck) and Jessie Veeder (Watford City), Private Business: Office Sign Co. (Fargo). The recipients of the 2021 Governor's Awards for the Arts, from 27 nominations, were as follows: Arts in Education: Dr. JoAnn Miller (Fargo); Arts Organization: Minot Area Council of the Arts (Minot); Individual Achievement: Melissa Gordan (Bismarck) and David Trottier (Rugby); Individual Cultural Heritage: Rex Cook (Dickinson); and Private Business: Enderlin Municipal Fine Arts Association with Maryhill Manor (Enderlin).

Recipients of this award are chosen for their efforts to expand arts opportunities to new audiences, create an appreciation for North Dakota's cultural heritage, and make the arts more central to education and an integral part of community life as well as on their length of service within the state. Legislators, community members and arts constituents attended.

News: The Council continues to produce its monthly electronic Prairie Arts newsletter. The agency has increased its use of Facebook, Instagram and YouTube with a corresponding increase in followers. During COVID, NDCA partnered with several writers to follow community arts activities that were ingeniously happening all over the state. Prairie Public produced a podcast of these "Little Stories".

Americans for the Arts Economic Impact Study: The North Dakota Council on the Arts participated in a study on the economic impact of the arts in North Dakota, published in 2017. The results demonstrated the exceptional impact of the arts on the economy of our state. The survey was conducted by Americans for the Arts, the nation's leading nonprofit organization for advancing the arts and arts education. NDCA and three ND cities (Minot, Bismarck, Fargo) will continue their participation in the most comprehensive economic impact study of the nonprofit arts and culture industry ever conducted in the United States, *Arts & Economic Prosperity 6*, this year. www.nd.gov/arts/sites/default/files/PDFs/nd_aep5report17.pdf.

Partnership in Main Street Initiative Programs: In 2019, NDCA designed and facilitated two panel discussions and a roundtable, attended by over 280 participants and students focused on placemaking in rural communities during the 2019 Main Street Summit. This led to the start of the *Arts Across the Prairie* program. In 2020, artist Keynotes at the Summit included Stephen Holden (WA), Jay Salinas (WI) and Keith Bear (ND) along with an NDCA panel discussion centered on Arts Partnerships and Resilient Communities.

Art in the Capitol: In 2019/20, in partnership with the Governor and the Capitol, the Council continued an exhibition program featuring North Dakota artists in the following locations: the Treasury Office, the Attorney General's office, the Auditor's Office and the Governor's Staff Offices. In 2021, NDCA moved its exhibition program to the 18th Floor Observation Deck along with the Governor's Staff Office; biennial artists included Pieper Bloomquist- Grand Forks, Char Marie Flood-Harwood, Donna Cristy-Bismarck, Beverly Haas-Dickinson, Andrew Stark-Fargo, and Eric Johnson-Fargo.

The North Dakota Governor's Photo Contest is a collaborative program between the Governor's office, North Dakota Tourism, and NDCA, with contest sponsor Triple AAA. All North Dakota photographers are encouraged to submit photos that capture the unique things to see and do in the state. The winner's works, announced online, were displayed at the Capitol in 2019 and at the Heritage Center in 2020.

Kennedy Center – "Arts Across America" – NDCA had the opportunity to participate in a nationally telecast program, "Arts Across America", produced by the Kennedy Center. Three amazing ND artists (Hamzat Koriko-Grand Forks, Chuck Suchy-Mandan, and Tom Porter-Bismarck) represented a breadth of musical talent including African drum and song, folk and choral work respectively.

NDCA Exhibit the Heritage Center: An exhibit was developed titled *Narrative Geometry: The Art of Warli by Vaishali Mohite*. This exhibit featured a traditional folk painting style from India. Three activity plans with an eye towards health and wellness for elders were developed in relation to the exhibit. This exhibit traveled to the care facility in LaMoure, ND along with animals from the Chahinkapa Zoo. A second exhibit featuring veterans was under development with elders in the care facilities at Lakota and Valley City, ND.

Awards and Recognition:

The Council and its grantees were recognized in many ways during this biennium, including:

- A \$60,000 Leveraging State Investment in Creative Aging grant from NASAA/Aroha for the Tiny Print Press Project.
- The Folk Arts and Art for Life Programs were featured in the Smithsonian Institution's *Folklife Magazine* for its successful responses to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- NDCA was asked by Indiana University to contribute a chapter featuring folk arts responses to Covid-19 to their forthcoming book *Behind the Mask: Vernacular Culture in the Time of Covid*.
- As part of the Main Street Summits, several awards were given to ND arts organizations. In 2019, the Arts and Culture Award was given to the Jamestown Arts Center. In 2020, the New Rockford Summer Street Market received the Arts and Culture Award while the Maddock Opera House received the Legendary Heritage Award.
- NDCA assisted two church (Hallson and Vidar) organizations in northeastern ND receive grants from Partners for Sacred Places to raise funds to fix their churches and help them transition the buildings into community presentation centers.

Special Partnerships:

- Two Tribal partnerships began with NDCA including United Tribes Technical College and the Northern Plains Oyate in 2019. The Native American Development Center and First People's Fund of South Dakota partnered with NDCA to host "Train the Trainers", a program geared to Native artists to provide leadership and administrative training. The project is funded by a Consensus Council Grant, and will, after many COVID delays, take place in February 2022.

- NDCA’s partnership with Dakota Legacy allowed the creation of an audio/podcast series called “TellTale”, which aired on Prairie Public Broadcasting as well as the veterans project currently underway as part of the Art for Life Program.
- Prairie Public Broadcasting, with financial assistance through an NDCA Letter of Agreement, resulted in five film features, seven taped performances, 221 radio and digital pieces, and 36 ND Band features over the biennium!
- In 2020, NDCA began a partnership with Souris Basin Regional Council to fund a project manager for *Arts Across the Prairie* via the Federal AmeriCorps Service Program. Kelli Schmidt (Minot), worked with NDCA in 2020 and 2021.
- In partnership with Arts Midwest’s Grow, Invest, Gather (GIG) Fund provided financial support to arts organizations for rebuilding and re-imagining creative engagement in their communities amidst the challenging uncertainty affecting all corners of the creative sector. The ND organizations that received funding were: Artwise (Grand Forks), Bismarck Art Galleries & Association (Bismarck), Bridges Arts Council (Valley City), Mouse River Players (Minot), ND Museum of Art (Grand Forks), African Arts Arena (Grand Forks), Red River Valley Community Action (Grand Forks), Plains Art Museum (Fargo), and Sleepy Hollow Theatre and Arts Park (Bismarck). All nine groups utilized funds for artist presentations.

D. Trends, Short-term and Long-term Goals:

Funding from the NEA increased in FY20 by \$6,600 for a total of \$731,200. In FY21 the funding increased by an additional \$10,733 to \$741,933, approaching the highest funding received in FY12 of \$764,500. Our goals include maintaining our grants program to the best of our ability during leaner fiscal years.

E. Summary of Expenditures and Revenues:

Funding for the Council is comprised of general funds as appropriated by the State Legislature and federal grant funding received from the NEA. The 19-21 biennium also saw the receipt of COVID-relief federal and special funds. Additionally the Council earns a very modest income each biennium through the sale of its various publications and art pieces.

The Council’s **Arts in Education Director** Rebecca Engelman served as a board member for the North Dakota STEM Ecosystem and North Dakota Afterschool Network.

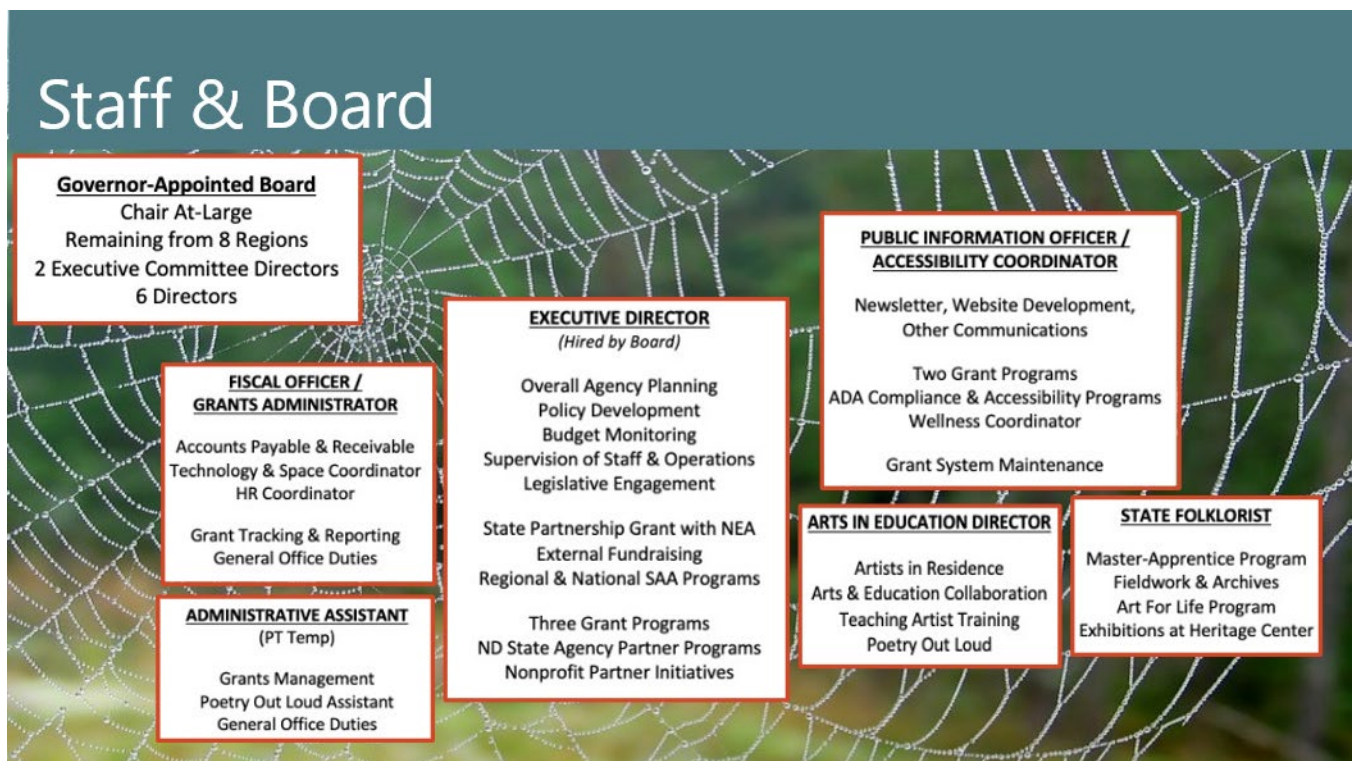

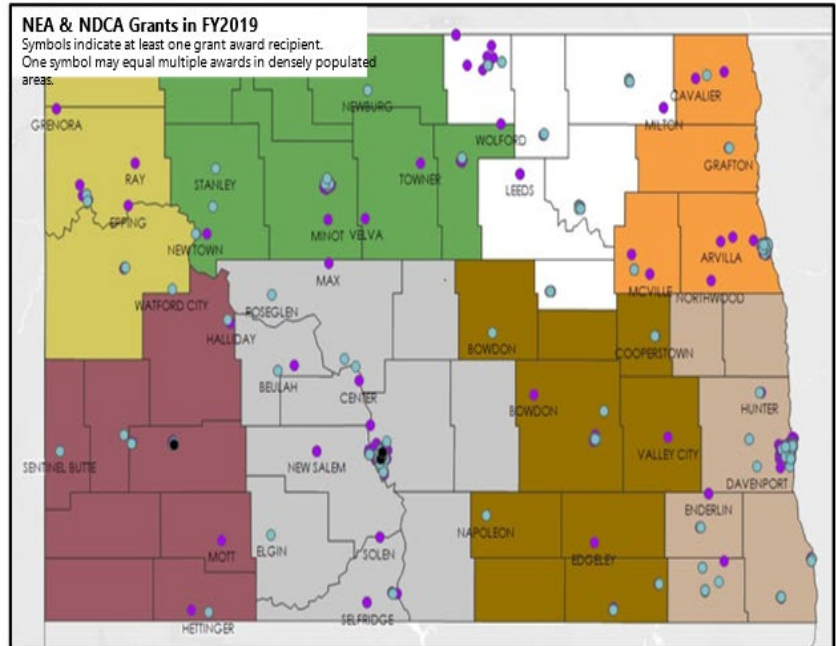

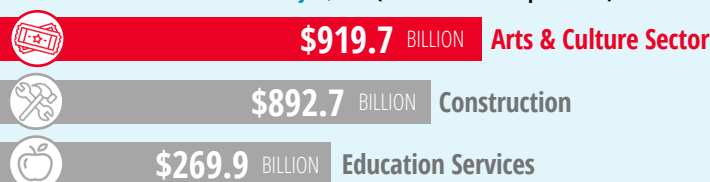

Q So how much is the federal government investing in the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)?

A Congress allocated **\$167.5 million** to the NEA in FY 2021, which has been relatively level for the last several years. This amounts to just **51¢** per capita, yet the nonprofit arts industry generates over \$13 billion in federal tax revenue back to the U.S. Treasury. Imagine what nonprofit arts groups could generate with \$1 per capita.

Q What about ND—how much does state government budget to the North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) each year?

A In **FY 20-21**, the state allocated **\$809,342** to NDCA. The Council also received **\$766,800** in federal NEA funds, which they re-granted funds to dozens of cultural organizations throughout the state. Another **8** nonprofit arts organizations received direct grants from the NEA totaling **\$282,500**.
