NDCA announces winners of the 2018 Poetry Out Loud State Finals

The North Dakota Council on the Arts (NDCA) is pleased to announce Maria Modi Tuya of Fargo North High School, as the 2018 State Champion and first place winner of the North Dakota State *Poetry Out Loud: National Recitation Contest*. Kayli Stanger of Shanley High School received second place honors. Placing third was Maggie Weeks of Magic City Campus, Minot High School. Maria Modi Tuya will advance to the National Finals in Washington, DC on April 23-25, 2018, where a total of \$50,000 in cash and school stipends will be awarded. This year's North Dakota Poetry Out Loud State Finals competition took place on Monday, February 26, at the North Dakota Heritage Center & State Museum in Bismarck, ND.

Provided in partnership with The National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), the Poetry Foundation, and NDCA, *Poetry Out Loud* is a national arts education program that encourages the mastery of great poetry by offering educational materials and a dynamic competition to high schools across the country. *Poetry Out Loud* uses a pyramid structure. Beginning at the classroom level, winners advance to the school-wide competition, then to the state competition, and ultimately to the National Finals in Washington, DC.

At the school, state, and national competitions, contestants recite works selected from an anthology of more than 400 classic and contemporary poems. The NEA and Poetry Foundation provide support materials for classroom instruction, including a standards-based teacher's guide, a comprehensive website, and a CD featuring poetry recitations by well-known actors and writers such as Anthony Hopkins, Alyssa Milano, N. Scott Momaday, and Rita Dove.

Emcee Elizabeth Gross, *Poetry Out Loud* Coordinator Rebecca Engelman, Policy Advisor at North Dakota Office of the Governor Jace Beehler, and NDCA Executive Director Kim Konikow presented the awards to the participants. All participating contestants received a \$20 book store gift card, gift bag and a certificate of participation. First place winner Maria Modi Tuya received a trophy, medallion, \$200, plus an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, DC. Maria's school, will also receive a \$500 stipend for the purchase of poetry books and the honor of displaying the POL Traveling Trophy. Second place winner Kayli Stanger received a trophy, medallion, \$100, plus \$200 for her school library. Third place winner Maggie Weeks received a trophy, and medallion.

The North Dakota state competition judges included: Nita K. Ritzke, Ph.D., Associate Professor of Humanities, University of Mary; Donna Stack, Former Associate Professor of

Communications, University of Mary; Bill Thomas, Director of Radio, Prairie Public; Shadd Piehl, North Dakota Associate Poet Laureate and Academic Dean of Rasmussen College Online; and the accuracy judges were Bonnie Larson Staiger, CEO of the Staiger Consulting Group, and Robin Bosch, Administrative Officer for NDCA. Live entertainment during the event was provided by David Diebel of Bismarck, and Joe Davis and The Poetic Diaspora.
